



RAY TREVORAH LIFE MEMBER 1963

Ray Trevorah was a foundation member of the original Cheltenham Club when it was formed in 1953. Ray was the new Club's first Coach for 1953 and 1954 and the President for 10 years 1954 – 1963.

Ray joined the Club as an experienced catcher and continued for 8 seasons playing 108 games between 1953 and 1960 before he retired as a player. Records from the early years showed that he was a contact hitter who seldom struck out and batted around the .300 mark.

In 1953 he batted .325, collected 27 hits, 18 BB, scored 39 runs and batted in 18 runs along with 24 stolen bases with an OBP of .450. Good numbers in any league.





Ray's son Michael and grandson Dylan were both to become leading players in the Club's first nine teams in the 50 years following the Amalgamation.

The Club's MVP Award for A Grade in the DBA competition is named in his honour.
